This year "Smt. Nandini P. Divatia Rural Rehabilitation Institutional Award" was given to National Association for Blind – Bombay and Apang Manav Mandal of Ahmedabad for their extensive services to rural divyangs.

The workshops have received very good response from various institutions working for vocational rehabilitation of DAPs.

Women have always been one of the major concerns of RUDMI from its inception. This year though no major training workshop was organized. I am happy to see that the empowered women are actively working to produce organic fertilizers, dairying, kitchen gardening, small trading work. I am happy to learn that the trained women are the field of dairying, making jewellery and directly connecting them with the market. They are also participation in

gramsabha and programmes. The training for reproductive health and on the general issues affecting life and development of the rural women continued this year, we also worked for promotion of sanitary pads in adolescent girls.

I feel happy to note that RUDMI has started working for innovative programmes in mental health.

## Annual Report 2016-2017

Rural Development and Management Institute (RUDMI) has continued to work with same vigor and commitment on all the projects it has started so far. The main areas of working include health, women empowerment, HIV/AIDS, agriculture, animal husbandry, disability etc. Full account of the activities is provided in as follows: In all the activities in Surendranagar have extended to some 75 villages of six talukas. Our networking with NGOs expanded and networked with 20 to 25 more NGOs. But our main focus was on developing new innovative project to be under taken by the institutions.

As always our main focus was on building capacity of people who are out of the main stream development and also on modification of the systems so as to take advantages of growth and development to the grassroots.

#### 1. Smt. Nandini P. Divatia Rural Rehabilitation Awards

With a view to promote self employment among differently abled persons RUDMI instituted Smt. Nandini P. Divaita Rural Rehabilitation Awards in the

memory its trustee Late Smt. Nandini P. Divatia in 2007. The award consists of Rs. 15,000/-cash and certificate. The objective is to recognize the potential abilities of divyangs and award it with some funds which enable them to initiate their income generation activity.



This was the tenth year of these

awards. As usual, we invited more than 100 institutions in Gujarat and Maharashtra to send their nominations for these awards. Of which 23 institutions sent 37 nominations for this award.

The selection committee after detailed scrutiny of the nominations, the nominating institutions and the projects proposed by the nominees, selected 27 for this award. Very brief details of awardees are provide as under.

The award presentation ceremony was held on 3<sup>rd</sup> December, 2016 in presence of Pjya Shri Rameshbhai Oza (Bhaishree) as chief guest and Dr. Y. K. Alagh as guest of honour, Pujya Shri Rameshbhai Oza, Appreciated the work being done by the institution and appealed to the audience to spend some time with Divyang to remove their own depression. He said that those who become useful to others are yogi. He appreciated enthusiasm of awardees and blessed them. Dr. Y. K. Alagh also congratulated all the awardees and asked Nationalized Banks to come forward to help such people. He also requested awardees to realize their dreams at any cost. Technology will help them to fight with every difficulty – but you have to push all your activities.

As far as institutional awards are concerned, we received nominations for institutional awards of which following two institutions were awarded Smt. Nandini P. Divatia Rural Rehabilitation Institutional Award;

- 1. National Association for Blind, Mumbai
- 2. Apang Manav Mandal, Ahmedabad



The awards were received by trustees of both the above institutions.

## 2. Disability Development Cell

The cell is running "Employment Service Centre for DAPs "since 2011-12. With following objectives;

1. To motivate DAPs for wage employment.

- 2. To refresh and fine tune the skills/talents of DAP and make it more acceptable to the employer.
- 3. To build linkages between employers and DAPs.
- 4. To provide Placement Services
- 5. To ensure stability in wage employment.

The centre was initially funded by Navajbhai Ratan Tata Trust. But now it is self financed. We trained 25 DAPs in DTP and guided many more for education and employment.

## 3. Smt. N.P. Divatia Counselling Centre

The board of trustees of RUDMI has decided to give more emphasis on mental health and counseling this year the centre spent reasonable time in developing new programs. A special training module, titled as "incredible Years: Ages & Stages" is prepared for the children of the age group of 13 to 16 years. The module was also tasted in Kameshwar School (English Medium) with 24 students. It has been a very effective program. In terms of its encouraging feedback from the students but also in opened up several now issues that school going children of this age face. Now we have started approaching other schools with this training module. The counseling center is also established in Umiya Arts & Commerce College for girls and it is working once in a week.

The counseling centre of Vadsar is entering into its \_\_\_\_\_ the year and more than \_\_\_\_ are counseled through this centre.



#### 4. Promotion of Farmers Club

We are working on VVV farmers club since 2011. Last year we formed 20 new clubs where 279 farmers joined. This year we organized meets with expert for each club. Shri Vadi Saheb (District – Agriculture Officer), Shri Raghubhai Rathod (Extension Officer, Agriculture – Patdi) Mr. Pathak Jain (Jain Irrigation Pvt. Ltd.), Mr. Vastal Bhatt (Netafim Irrigation Pvt. Ltd.), Mr. Savdas Aal and

Jaydeepsinh Vaghela (ATMA) shared their experience and knowledge with farmers as experts and also attended to their queries.

The main issues discussed include soil degradation, selection of seeds and fertilizers, importance of deep tilling, Atma Project, how to sow cumins, etc.



Many of the suggestions made by experts were implemented by the farmers. Some of the farmers of these clubs were provide with free of charge through ATMA project.

All clubs have bank accounts and majority of them have good amount collected through savings in their account.

The working of almost '3' years has resulted in change in cropping pattern in favour of wheat and Cummins (Dhana) better irrigation management and optimization in fertilizer consumption. The monthly meetings are being conducted every month in all the 40 clubs. The meetings are used for collective decisions about seeds/seeding, fertilizers and agricultural technology. As a part of Digital India Movement this year we motivated and helped all the member farmers to register with e-khedut where they are eligible to get all useful information on weather and agriculture on their mobiles. Large numbers of farmers were benefited by information and inputs provide by the government. All the 20 farmers clubs participated in Krishi Mahotsava.

## 5. Dairy Milk Co-operative

Fortunately all the 16 Co-operative Milk Society of 16 villages of Dasada Taluka of Surendranagar District established before 10 years are functioning and generating sizeable revenue for the members. It is learnt that on an average around 56000 ltrs. of milk is being sold to Sur-Sagar Dairy. Earning more than Rs. 22,40,000/- for 3700 members. The average fat of buffalo milk is the range of 6% to 8% and cow milk 4 to 5 percent. The current prices are Rs. 600 for Buffalo milk. Zezra dairy; all women dairy is in the leading position with its best performance among all the dairies in Patdi Taluka.

#### 6. Health Interventions

Pahonch programme to create awareness on the issues related to health among rural and medically underserved areas completed last year. This year we continued to provide our services on Mamta Divas and to help emergency cases. Besides this we took up the issue of hygiene of adolescent and young girls and explained them about the sanitary napkins and advantage of using it. We distributed sanitary pads to around 200 girls at concessional rates. However this issue requires more intensive work.

#### 7. Student Enrichment Programme

The computer skill support program undertaken in 5 rural schools got completed with reparis of all their computers and with creating basic understanding on computer operations. This year during summar vacation, some studetns joined computer classes and learnt Gujarati typing and MS

office.

Another major program was undertaken with Umiya Arts & Commerce College. We created a training workshop "Indian women: from Revolt to Present Day".

This 15 days workshop discussed the role of all the women leaders at different paint of time between 1857 to till date. The workshop was very empowering for girls of the college. Morethan 7 seniours faculties addressed these girls.

## 8. Research Activity

Government of India established Smart City Mission in 2015.

Surat is one among 20 cities selected by Government of India to make them small cities. Smart City essentially involves infrastructural development in governance and empowerment of people. Surat has already received first installment of the grant and has started implementation of the schemes/programs.

RUDMI through Satra Infrastructure Mgt. Pvt. Ltd., was assigned to conduct Socio-economic Study of the residents of Surat and assess the impact of development initiatives under taken during the year. The study is based on the sample survey of 9000 HHs and with various community groups. The sample is selected through random sampling method. Twenty six indicators were selected to assess the socio economic status of the city. These include location, climate, connectivity, topology, soil demography, share of slums, access to water, energy, health facilities, education, housing, employment

etc., governance, social security, living standards, sources of income expenditure pattern etc. The tools are prepared covering all the basic socio-economic parameters and the collected data is analysed. The report assesses economic impact, social impact, impact on environment and natural resources. It also carried out SWOT analysis.

Besides this, annual report for 2016 of Sardar Patel Institute of Public Administration (SPIPA) was prepared by the institute.

#### **CSR Center**

RUDMI established CSR center for providing services to industries. The main objective of the selecting relevant and output focusing projects help them implementing them efficiently so as to get best outcome of the money spent on CSR.

Keeping this in view center provides following services
